







The third edition of "Youth at the Top" took place on July 11th and July 12th in six Alpine countries and three countries of the Carpathians. This time, the international youth event hosted 48 events which involved numerous different day and night activities. Hence, more than 500 enthusiastic young people from Germany, France, Switzerland, Austria, Italy, Slovenia, Poland, Romania and Slovakia set out on a great adventure to discover the treasures of the mountain environment.

The youngsters took part in several discoveries on nature conservation, learnt about fauna and flora in the mountain environment, built a bat or a bird house, engaged in painting, climbing or treasure hunting.

"We spotted several wild animals such as bouquetins, chamois, marmots, bearded vultures, squirrels and tons of insects!" crows Daniele who participated at the event in the Parco Nazionale Gran Paradiso.

At dusk, children, teenagers and adults sat around the fire, singing songs, gazing at the stars while some of them performed artistic activities.

"The concrete results and the emotions of the young participants are among the things that gratify us the most and that give a meaning to all the work done on this project in the last months" states Elena Maselli, Parc national du Mercantour.

The overall goal of "Youth at the Top" is to reconnect the younger generation with their living environment and raise their awareness regarding the protection of the Alps and the interconnectedness of the Alpine territory. A novelty in the third YAT edition was the distribution of the teaching tool "The Alps in my Backpack" — a large canvas with a map of the Alps including various options for educational purposes.

The time leading up to the next edition of YAT in 2018 is a precious resource for the continued experiencing and preserving of the mountains and nature, gathering new stories and experiences before the youngsters all meet up and reach the top again.
